
**The Orientarium is designed as a new part of the Łódź Zoological Garden.**

# Entrance pavilion




Architectural accent that underlines the scale of the object is the entrance pavilion with the headlining and the floor finished with ornament of a pentagonal motif referring to the plumeria flower commonly found in Indonesia.

# Walk in an Asian village

Opposite the pavilion, there will be a complex of huts characteristic for Sumatran architecture and gastronomic facilities - food court and as an attraction, mainly for the youngest visitors, small animal stables.



**In case of bad weather, visitors can walk under roofed alleys.**



**In the elephant house and Sunda Islands exhibit you will see cottages with cascading thatched roofs characteristic for Bali architecture. In the part of Sulawesi exhibit, the pavilion crowning the outer shelter was designed as the Tana Toraja architecture.**






Sharks and rays
